Sand County Foundation's Pollinator Habitat Grant Program helps high school teachers and students to create or expand habitat and reverse the decline of essential insect pollinators and monarch butterflies.

Few education programs actively engage students in agricultural-focused conservation management. Our successful Pollinator Habitat Grant Program brings applied conservation opportunities into classrooms to boost students' educational experience and capture their interest as they consider career options. Since 2017, Sand County Foundation has provided grants to 87 high schools engaging more than 100 teachers and more than 8,000 students to plant over 55,000 wildflower plants in agricultural areas.
