#### **Overview**

Sand County Foundation's Pollinator Habitat Education Program provides a unique hands-on learning experience, guides K-12 teachers in growing native wildflowers with their students, and restores critical pollinator habitat. Created in 2017, the program has engaged over 170 schools across Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Illinois. Thousands of students have gained practical conservation skills, an increased awareness of the importance of essential pollinators, and a greater sense of ability to take meaningful action for the environment.

#### **New This Year!**


In the 2024-2025 school year, we launched a version of the program, accessible to all ages, called the "Seed Starter Activity". Seventy schools and 8,500 students participated in its first year. This in-demand activity supplies teachers with free native wildflower and grass seeds, easy-to-follow growing instructions, and personalized guidance from our Education and Outreach Specialist.
